## Rider Education

### Knock Knock

I don't have a technical article for you this month. (Cheers in the background?) There are just so many opportunities for the training, both this month and next, that I thought I would just talk about some of that.

Fist up, it looks like the weather is going to allow us to have a Parking Lot Practice (PLP) on Saturday the 14<sup>th</sup> of March. Yes, that is next Saturday. It will be right after our monthly meeting and everyone is invited, everyone. PLP's are no-charge, informal training sessions that allow participants to practice at their own pace. This year I found a course that works with both trikes and bikes. I haven't set it up and run it myself but I expect it to be challenging for both two and three-wheels.

The PLP is a good warm up for the Advanced Riders Course (ARC) in Richland on Sunday the 22<sup>nd</sup> of March, one week after our meeting. This will be a one-day course made up of approximately 3 hours of classroom time and 5 hours of range time. Many have taken this course in a two-day format with the classroom time one evening and the range time the following day, This class is the same as the two day course but simply done in one day. The ARC is for any motorcyclist who has basic riding skills. If you can ride to the course then you are capable of taking the ARC. The ARC has something for all riders regardless of their experience level. I took the ARC many years after taking the beginners course and while I considered myself an experienced rider at the time the instructors found me making several mistakes, bad habits really, and helped me correct them.

In April there are several more training events of note. On

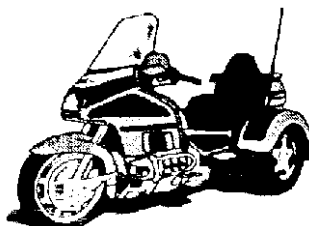

Saturday April 11 there will be a Trike Riders Course (TRC) in Richland, WA at the same facility as the ARC. This will also be a one-day course. This format works well as the students get to immediately practice the techniques discussed in the classroom, the two-day format is preferable when the weather is hot or the students have to travel considerable distance. The TRC, like the ARC is for riders of all skill levels above raw beginner. If you can ride your trike to the class, you have the riding skills necessary to participate in the class. This class will sharpen those basic skills and allow you to practice some more advanced techniques as well.



On Sunday the 12<sup>th</sup> of April there will be a Trailer Class. Many Gold Wingers pull trailers but few have had any formal instruction concerning them. This should prove to be an interesting class and one that I am particularly looking forward to.



Later in April, over the weekend of 25-26, there are two events happening at the same time. In Richland, WA

there is a Sidecar class scheduled. This is something that hasn't been offered very often and if you have a sidecar or think you might want to operate a sidecar then this class is for you.

At the same time as the sidecar class is being held in Richland, the Yakima Police Department is giving a free training seminar for Gold Wingers in Selah, WA. This is aimed more towards the experienced rider and is focused on developing advanced skills but even riders who consider themselves basic riders or novices can pick up some good instruction. The Yakima Police Department Motorcycle Officers are truly experts with motorcycles, as are all law enforcement motor officers. They are trained to an incredible degree and in this case are willing to share some of that training. This is a unique opportunity and should not be missed. Lunch is available on-site for \$5.00.

I truly hope everyone who is interested in attending any of these training opportunities is able to do so. I call them "opportunities" rather than "classes" because they are not something that has to be done, they are not required, and they are not prerequisites for membership in GWARRA. They are simply and truly opportunities to improve our skills and knowledge and will help make us better, safer motorcycle operators. Opportunity is knocking, who's going to answer?

## NOTES FROM IRAQ

This message was received from WA-L member Jerry Myhres:

Hi there to all the GWRRA members,

I got your email, in fact, I get all of them. I am still over in Iraq. I worked for one company for 6 months and in that time I was asked to look into going to work for the Department of Defense by a Lt. Col. I have now been working for DoD (Dept of Defense) for nearly a year, and have just signed up for one more year working on the MRAP - (MINE RESISTANT AMBUSH PROTECTED -- <http://www.defenselink.mil/home/features/2007/mrap/>) program. These are the vehicles that keep our guys and gals in the green uniforms alive when hit by IED's. They are doing their job very well, and I am glad that I am a part of this program. I feel like most people that we need to end this as soon as possible, but while we are here, I want to do my part to make the soldiers time here as safe as possible.

I still don't own a "working" Gold Wing; mine is in a big pile in the garage, but I am going to either rebuild that one, or buy a new one when I get home for good. I look forward to finally having the time to get together and ride/associate, instead of just showing up for the occasional meeting. Tell everyone to take care, and I will see you when I get home.

## HOUSEHOLD HELPERS

- Press in the ends on the box of foil or wax paper to keep the roll locked in place.
- To determine whether an egg is fresh, immerse it in a pan of cool, salted water. If it sinks, it is fresh; if it rises to the surface, throw it away.
- Poke an egg with a small sewing needle before hard-boiling, and the egg will peel with ease! And hold that needle in place with a magnet refrigerator clip!
- Zap garlic cloves in the microwave for 15 seconds and the skins slip right off!
- To prevent egg shells from cracking, add a pinch of salt to the water before hard-boiling!
- Use a pastry blender to cut ground beef into small pieces after browning!
- Spray your plasticware with non-stick cooking spray before pouring in tomato-based sauces; no more stains!
- Wrap celery in aluminum foil when putting in the refrigerator it will keep for weeks!
- Slicing meat when partially frozen makes it easier to get thin slices.
- Substitute half applesauce for the vegetable oil in your baking recipes; you'll greatly reduce the fat content! (Example: 1/2 cup vegetable oil = 1/4 cup applesauce + 1/4 cup oil)
- To ripen avocados and bananas, enclose them in a brown paper bag with an apple for 2-3 days!
- Place a slice of bread in hardened brown sugar to soften it back up!
- When boiling corn on the cob, add a pinch of sugar to help bring out the corns natural sweetness!
- If you have problem opening jars, try using latex dishwashing gloves. They give a non-slip grip that makes opening jars easy!
- Fruit Freshener - Use 2 vitamin C tablets in a big bowl of water...let them dissolve and stir...dunk any veggie or fruit and it will stay fresh for a couple of weeks and vitamin C won't hurt you either! Try it out on a potato... dunk the potato and leave it out on the sink...it won't discolor... It's the short version of "fruit fresh".
- How about a low cost window cleaner: Add just a drop of Dawn dish liquid to 3 cups of water.
- Windshield Wiper Frost Free Fluid: When you have to leave your car outside overnight in the winter, mix 3 parts vinegar to 1 part water and coat the windows with this solution. This vinegar and water combination will keep windshields ice and frost-free.
- Unclog a drain. Clear the sink drain by dropping three Alka-Seltzer tablets down the drain followed by a cup of Heinz White Vinegar. Wait a few minutes, then run the hot water.
