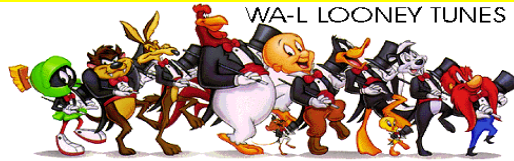

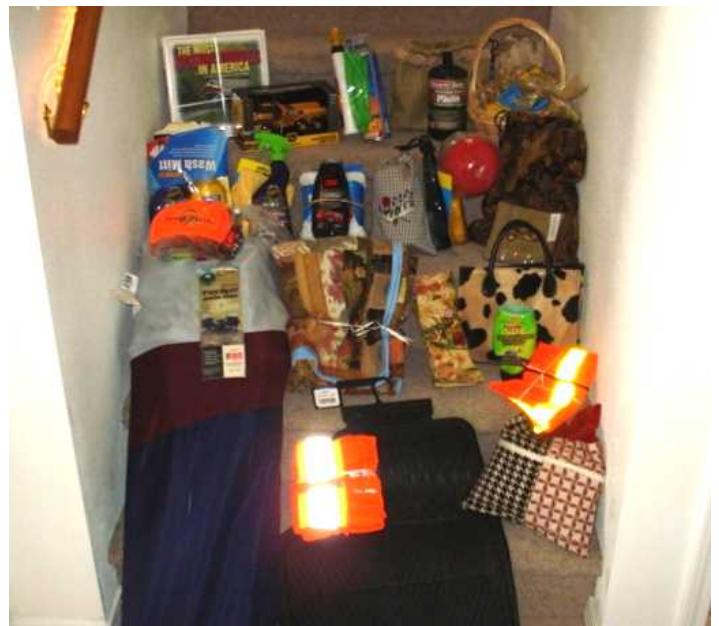

## Return of The Steel Drum Band!

Bram Brata will return to the Desert Spring Fling stage in 2009. The Tri-Cities Steel Band Association is a non-profit organization based in West Richland, Washington. The association began as an idea that was bounced around between a few parents of Kid Calypso (an elementary school steel band) players in the spring of 1996. The children had been introduced to steel drums and would soon have no opportunity for playing as they moved from Tapteal Elementary School, where music teacher Ben Leggett had formed Kid Calypso, to area middle schools where no steel drum programs were in existence. The band 'Bram Brata' met the needs of the few for a couple of years, but soon could not approach the needs of the many as more children needed an opportunity to use their many talents in playing steel drums. In an effort to meet the growing need, TCSBA added a second full band called 'OK2Botay', which formed in the fall of 1998. The result of having two bands has been the development of a "Varsity - Junior Varsity" approach. This means that any child may try out for OK2Botay, the JV band, and players for Bram Brata, the varsity band are taken from OK2Botay as openings occur, usually on an annual basis.

# Ride for Rover

On Sunday, April 19, 2009 several Chapter "L" members participated in a poker ride sponsored by Full Throttle Motorcycle accessories in Kennewick, WA to benefit the local Pet Over Population animal shelter. It is the only "No Kill" animal shelter in our area. Approximately 550 riders registered for this ride including our own Kelly Humble, Joe Winter and his Wife Sharron, Gary Domas, Santana Denny, past member Marjorie Gardner, and Tom Denny.

Everyone that registered received a "meal" ticket and a grand prize ticket. The weather couldn't have been better as small groups left the staging area (Full Throttle's parking lot in Kennewick) and rode to Crazy Mary's near Wallula Junction, then to the Plymouth Tavern in Plymouth. From Plymouth it was north over the hill into Prosser, WA where the route got on Wine Country Road and headed east, eventually ending up at PetSmart in Kennewick where Chapter L's Gene and Pam Meyers were manning the checkpoint. From PetSmart it was a short ride to the Dairy Queen on Gage Blvd where the "meal" ticket got every one that registered a free lunch consisting of a double cheeseburger and a drink. Now that's the way to end a ride. Of course the friendly folks at DQ were glad to serve up some ice cream for those that wanted some and many did. Outside some tables were set up where poker hands were drawn, winning grand prize tickets were posted and prizes were given out. Gary Domas won a dinner at Hill's restaurant in Kennewick.



This ride raised a lot of money for the No Kill animal shelter. On a sadder note one of the participants was involved in a fatal accident. Details are sketchy but a rider left the road and sustained grave injuries. Several riders stopped to help and perform CPR until the ambulance arrived but the rider was pronounced dead on arrival at Kadlec Hospital in Richland.

# LETTER FROM IRAQ

Hello there Chapter L,  
Yup, I'm still in Iraq. I will be home for 2 weeks starting around 20 May. I just wanted to drop a quick note and see if anyone out there wants an '84 Aspencade project bike. I started restoring it and then came over here, so it has sat torn apart for nearly 2 years, and I don't see me coming home for at least another year. So, it is for sale. It all started with the infamous stator failure, so the bike got torn down. Here is what I have:

Engine with 51k on it. I have a new stator and all the installation parts needed for it, new carb kits and air valve. The wheels have new tires mounted on them (they have not been balanced yet). All of the bags and fairing (they are the Saddle Tan Color). There are some minor things wrong with the bags, such as small cracks but overall they are in good shape. The instrument cluster and radio work fine. I have the aftermarket intercom setup for it (the one that plugs into the stock wiring). It had a lot of extra chrome stuff on it that had some light rust in places. I wasn't going to put the chrome back on it, but it's there. I have the title to it, and would like to sell it as a complete "kit", but I may part it out. If someone wants it for a parts bike or a project, I will sell it for \$1250.00. If you look on Ebay and add up just some of the stuff it is worth way more than that, but I don't want to mess around with it anymore. I have all of the misc. bolts and hardware, but I am sure there will be things that someone would have to locate if they wanted to put in back together completely such as the air lines from the fairing.

Like I said, I will be home around 20 May and could deliver it then. Or my son is at my house, and could help someone pick it up earlier. They would have to wait until May to get the title however. Thanks for passing this around, and I hope to see you guys at the rally.

## GWRRR Trike and Trailer Courses Held

On Saturday morning April 11, five people showed up for the Trike Riders Course put on by GWRRR in north Richland. The class was taught by instructors Tim Mitchell and Chris Morton from ID-H and Tom Denny from WA-L and supervised by Eric Carlson the Region "I" Rider Instructor Coordinator. Joyce LoParco, Doug Heider and Santana Denny from WA-L along with Dale Snipes and Larry Barham from Idaho all arrived with the expectation of learning more about their trikes and of becoming better trike riders.

The Classroom portion covered technical information about trikes and traction as well as information about riding safely and defensively and about taking care of yourself with the proper riding gear and mental attitude. After lunch it was over to the range where everyone got to practice basic techniques like stopping and low speed cornering. By the end of the day everyone was demonstrating more aggressive maneuvers like quick stops in a corner and swerving to avoid obstacles. While the class members all came with different levels of experience and ability it was obvious that everyone learned something and each student left the class a better, more informed and safer trike rider. It looked they had a good time as well.

On Easter Sunday, the 12<sup>th</sup> of April the same three instructors taught a Trailering Course at the same location. This course was developed by and is offered through GWRRR. It is designed to provide information in the classroom to riders about pulling trailers safely and to learn and practice riding skills with a trailer attached. The lone couple attending the class, Ron and Tammy Clements from chapter WA-R, arrived to overcast skies that promised rain by early afternoon.

The range portion starts off simply and gets more advanced as the rider builds skill and confidence. Ron is a good rider who rode all the exercises with his co-rider on the bike. Tammy thought it was important that co-riders learn what to do as well as the driver. With only one bike and trailer combination the class moved along a good rate and by about 1:45 in the afternoon with the rain coming down in earnest it was complete. Ron and Tammy both said they had a good time in spite of the rain. After hugs and handshakes they rode home with new confidence in their trailer handling skills.

These classes could not have happened the way they did without the invaluable assistance of Chip Haas. Chip showed up early both days to open the classroom and start the coffeepot. He even bought doughnuts for the classes. In the afternoon he brought his camera to the range and took pictures. He did this on his own time and on Easter Weekend. When you see Chip tell him thanks for his support of Chapter "L" and the Riders Education Program. Thank you, Chip.
